

Chair Descriptions International Chair

The International Chair is to promote activities, projects, and/or opportunities in ways we can learn and/or help internationally. Remember they must be approved by the Executive Board before you can proceed. Some suggestions are:

- Water.org
- Kiva.org
- International Festivals
- International Food Festivals
- Learn from WCOF members who were born or who have family in other countries
- Any other international activity or education

In doing Helping Hands projects sometimes it is easier to partner with another charitable organization for efficiency and cost effectiveness such as:

- Collecting eye glasses by teaming with the Lions Club who have infrastructure and means to have them sent to the needy abroad
- Coins for Unicef (these were coins from different nations) we teamed with the Orange District and had them send it out
- In other words the project does not have to be something we do directly

The International Chair is to keep a binder of all activities to pass on to the next International Chair.

The International Chair is to keep track of volunteer hours, in-kind donation, money donated, and members who attended or were involved in an international activity and send that information to the Dean of Chairs within a month of the activity.

The International Chair shall attend all monthly General Meetings, and Board Meetings. If you can not attend one of the meetings report out to the Dean of Chairs
